One of the biggest setbacks of the Azusa Street Revival came with the sudden loss of their extensive mailing list in 1909. After some disagreement, Florence Crawford, the strong-willed secretary of the Apostolic Faith Mission abruptly left town with the extensive roster of subscribers. Without this, the mission's newspaper could no longer be circulated.

It seemed that the Fulton Street meeting had touched a nerve. The revival-prayer impulse flashed from coast to coast. On November 5, 1857, a New York newspaper carried the story of a revival in Hamilton, Ont., Canada, in which 300 to 400 people were converted in a few days. Accounts of local revivals began to appear in religious papers in November.
