Nursing Care Plans for Celiac Disease Nursing Care Plan 1. Nursing Diagnosis: Diarrhea related to intestinal inflammation secondary to Celiac disease as evidenced by loose, watery stools, abdominal cramping and pain, increased urgency to defecate, and increased bowel sounds

Children with Celiac Disease often have slow or stunted growth and development. Treatment requires a lifelong gluten-free diet to manage symptoms and further intestinal damage. If left untreated, celiac disease can lead to other, serious conditions including ADHD, epilepsy, diabetes, intestinal cancer, and infertility. Etiology

Nursing Intervention . Monitor dietary intake, fluid intake and output, weight, serum electrolytes, and hydration status. Make sure that the diet is free from causative agent, but inclusive of essential nutrients, such as protein, fats, vitamins, and minerals. Maintain NPO status during initial treatment of celiac crisis or during diagnostic testing.

NICE (2015) states that appropriate chronic disease management for patients with coeliac disease is a clinical priority for primary care professionals such as community nurses, but the same does not apply to nursing staff caring for patients admitted to hospital.

Celiac disease is an autoimmune disorder with genetic predisposition that affects as many as 1 in 100 individuals. Treatment is a lifelong, strict adherence to a gluten-free diet. Management by a primary care provider may lead to increased adherence and can minimize effects of nonadherence to the diet.

Primary care management of celiac disease : The Nurse ...

For persistent intestinal inflammation in patients with unresponsive or refractory celiac disease, the health care provider may need to prescribe steroids and or other immunosuppressive medications to help control the inflammation and promote healing of the intestinal tract (NIDDK, 2016).

Patient needs to keep a food diary along with the signs and symptoms and the nurse should assess the diet log (look for foods that contain gluten) Skin, teeth, weight (normal vs abnormal) Family history. Ability to read food labels and the patient's or families' knowledge about gluten.

Your doctor will monitor your response with blood tests. For most people with celiac disease, a gluten-free diet will allow the small intestine to heal. For children, that usually takes three to six months. For adults, complete healing might take several years.
